**After** 25 years as a bank executive, Curt Keyser was afforded the opportunity to enter a new industry cleaning and sealing outdoor wood, concrete and masonry. He took it. That was 6 years ago. A year ago, he decided to start his own company and Forever Sealed was born. Curt points out, "My brother and my son both work with me. We're proud to say we are locally and veteran owned as well as family operated."

Born in Fort Dix, New Jersey, Curt grew up as an Army brat and spent the majority of his life in Panama City Beach, Florida. He earned a Bachelor's degree and MBA from Florida State University, and also earned a Master's degree in Banking from Louisiana State University. Curt served 4 years in the Army in the 10th Mountain Light Infantry.

Curt explains the process that Forever Sealed uses, "We clean and seal outdoor wood, concrete and masonry using a liquid silicone sealant that actually penetrates wood by up to 6 inches, concrete by up to 3 inches and masonry or pavers by up to 1½ inches. Once the sealant penetrates the porous product, it chemically reacts with the natural acid inside each product to transform the liquid silicone into a hardened block." He continues, "That serves several purposes. First, it makes each product mold and mildew resistant. You literally do not have to pressure wash again as liquids are not able to penetrate the products. Second, in the case of wood, the liquid silicone will encase the natural fungus in wood that causes wood to rot. Encasing the fungus in a silicone block means moisture cannot reach the fungus, which means the wood will literally last forever. Third, the cured silicone will strengthen wood, concrete and masonry by over 20%.

"When it comes to pavers, we use a polymer sand that will congeal and essentially turn into a grout or mortar. That means moisture cannot penetrate between the pavers making it mold and mildew resistant. That also means vegetation cannot grow between the pavers. You know pavers have been properly sealed when water beads up on them. Keep in mind that the rainy season does not prevent us from cleaning and sealing concrete or wood," Curt explains.

## **Bicycle (and Pedestrian) Safety Tips**

- A cyclist on a sidewalk or crosswalk has the rights and duties of a pedestrian. A cyclist on the road has the rights and duties of a motor vehicle.
- A bicycle rider or passenger under 16 years of age must wear a bicycle helmet that is properly fitted, is fastened securely, and meets national standards
- Properly-fitted helmets can reduce the risk of head injuries by at least 45 percent – yet less than half of children 14 and under usually wear a bike helmet.
- Florida has ranked in the top 3 in bicycle and pedestrian fatalities every year since 2001.
- Every child is different, but developmentally, it can be hard for kids to judge speed and distance of cars until age 10, so limit riding to sidewalks (although be careful of vehicles in driveways), parks or bike paths until age 10. No matter where you ride, teach your child to stay alert and watch for cars and trucks.
- Tell your kids to ride on the right side of the road, with traffic, not against it. Stay as far to the right as possible. Use appropriate hand signals and respect traffic signals, stopping at all stop signs and stoplights. Be predictable when riding.
- When riding at dusk, dawn or in the evening, be bright and use lights

   and make sure your bike has reflectors as well. It's also smart to wear
   clothes and accessories that have retro-reflective materials to improve biker
   and pedestrian visibility to motorists.
- Most states require a front light but allow the use of a rear reflector. Headlights aren't so much for bicyclists to see where they are going but for others to see them. Riding without a headlight means drivers won't see you, and surprising motorists is never a good idea.

# Reminders for Driving & Parking in Cory Lake Isles

Speed limit is 25MPH

- -Please drive within the limit throughout the entire community.
  - -Please come to a complete stop at the stop signs.
- -When parking in your driveway, please do not block the sidewalk.

Blocking sidewalks violates the American's with Disabilities Act, a federal law, and causes an unsafe situation when pedestrians are forced to walk in the street.



# Local Mom Launches Organization to Mentor Children of Domestic Violence

Christina Stork has begun the hard work of creating a program for children who have been affected by domestic violence. This passion project is near and dear to her heart because of her own experience.

"The reason I wanted to start my organization was because I was born into domestic violence. As a result of being exposed to this as a child, I entered an abusive relationship," Christina explained. "I was able to dissociate and stayed with my abuser for a decade. When the abuse escalated to gun violence, I started to

wake up. It was not until my mother told me, 'All men act that way,' that I knew something was wrong. I began noticing that my children were modeling abusive and reactive behaviors too. I started to reflect on my own childhood trauma, and started asking friends and family how abuse impacted them. It was always the same story. We suffered from low self-esteem, low self-worth, anger-management issues and we all went into abusive relationships. It was, and is, a vicious cycle, especially when we lack the necessary tools to overcome the

behaviors that we are learning during critical childhood brain development."


Christina, who is a Pasco County Schools Instructional Assistant, explains, "Through my organization, Lighthouse Productions S.M.M. - Your Port in the Storm, I hope to help stop the cycle of violence from continuing in children when they become adults. When we are exposed to domestic violence, no one is talking about it. In fact, we hide it due to shame, and because it is what we are learning from those in our immediate environment, it becomes normal to us, and we are told that we cannot talk about it. Once I had the courage to leave, I opened the doors of communication with my children. This has helped them tremendously, however, once my children felt, "safe," enough to talk about it, they turned to their friends. This caused an issue, because those children, had not been impacted by domestic violence."

"These children need a group setting where they can openly discuss what they have been through with other children and adults like them. It gets it all out on the table, and they can feel free. They can also learn from adults who have learned to overcome the triggers and the trauma they sustained, providing a true role model."

"My goal is to create an after school program that would mentor these children. This program would offer music, art, writing, group therapy, drum line, karate, boxing, fishing, and archery. All of these activities will teach kids coping mechanisms, as well as how to calm themselves in stressful situations. I am in the very early stages of planning and seeking funding. On top of that, I am a single mom, a full time employee, and a full time student. In November, I had a meeting with a couple of non-profit organizations about collaborating with others that shared a similar initiative, and starting a pilot program. I plan to start my own non-profit 501(c)(3) and run my program with volunteers who have been impacted by domestic violence. My goal is to keep the cost low, so that families do not have to pay."

# Reuben Quesadilla Recipe

4 whole grain tortillas

1 cup chicken or turkey

1 cup raw sauerkraut

8 oz Havarti or mild cheddar

DRESSING

3/4 cup mayo

1/4 cup ketchup

1 Tbls each finely minced onion, celery, and carrot

1 Tbls apple cider vinegar

1/2 tsp each Himalayan salt, pepper,

and granulated garlic

Heat a large griddle to medium heat. Place tortillas on hot surface and quickly apply ingredients in this order:

Cover the entire tortilla with cheese – this the glue. Then on one half of tortilla, layer chicken, sauerkraut, and dressing. Fold tortilla in half and let sit for a minute or two until golden brown then carefully flip and brown the other side.

Any leftover dressing can served on the side, used as a salad dressing, or as a dip for your favorite raw veggies.
